Hospice Palliative Care (HPC)

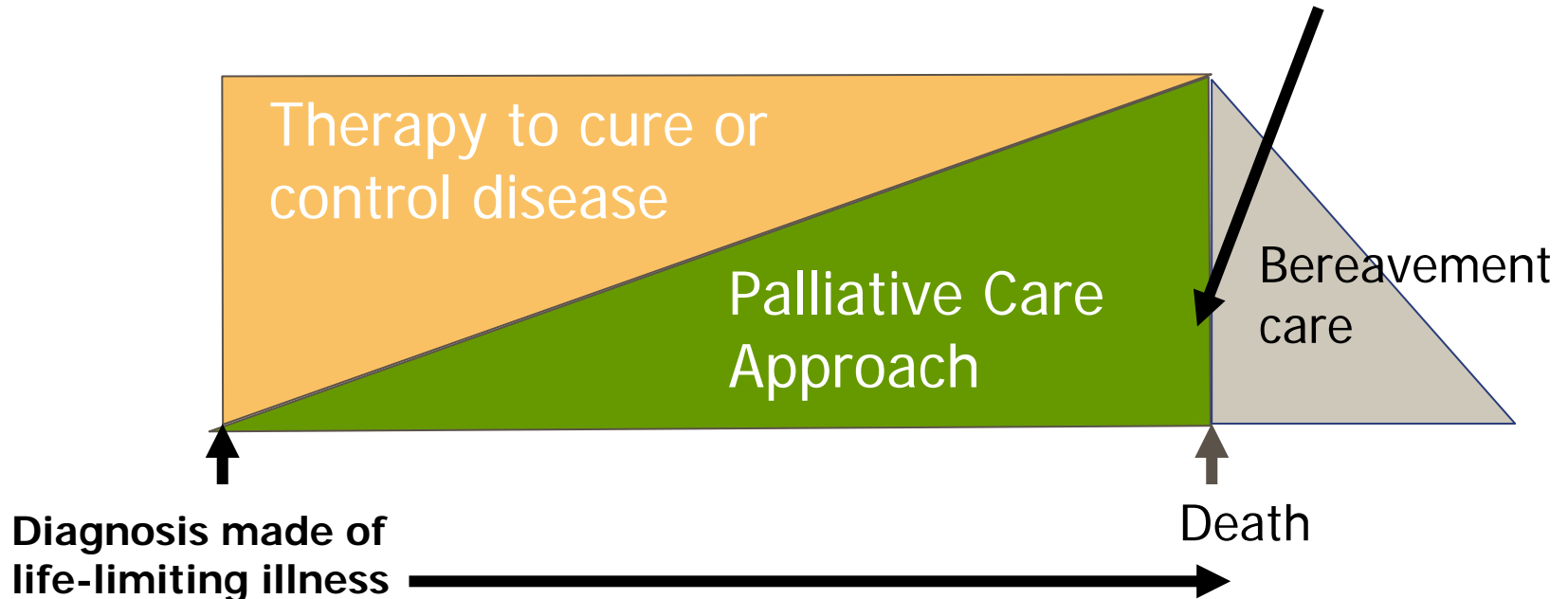
- A philosophy of care and range of active, supportive services provided across several settings of care to enhance the quality of living, dying and surviving.
- Appropriate for any patient and/or family living with, or at risk of developing, a life-threatening illness due to any diagnosis, with any prognosis, regardless of age, and at any time they have unmet expectations and/or needs, and are prepared to accept care.

Current Canadian Context

- ↑ Expected deaths with complex issues
- Pressure to move “beyond cancer”
 - End-stage organ failure (e.g., heart, lung, renal)
 - Neurological illness (e.g., Alzheimer’s, ALS, MS)
 - Immunological illness (e.g., HIV/AIDS)
- “Wicked” policy challenges (current zero sum game)
 - Social values (dignity, worth of human person, compassion) vs.
 - Affordability/sustainability of public health delivery
- Key early national contributions
- 13 major P/T health delivery systems; numerous sub-systems purview of Government of Canada
- Models of care increasingly disconnected from nature of lifespan and care requirements (e.g., chronic illness model)
- More pressure for safe, ethical and effective HPC



Goals of the Project (Phase II)

- Generally - Pallium Project
 - Improve access to hospice palliative care (HPC)
 - Enhance quality of living and dying
 - Make contributions to system capacity to respond in the longer-term
- Phase II (PHCTF)
 - Make a targeted, demonstrable and enduring contribution to the foundation of Canada's primary health care system early in the 21st Century, with focused emphasis on HPC.



Guiding Concepts

- *Many hands make light work*
- Coordinate, Collaborate, Communicate and Catalyze (4 C's)
- Interdependence of paid/unpaid providers
- Engage people who do the work in developing the knowledge/resources
- Emphasize “access” over “ownership” in distribution of resources jointly-created



Key Results

- 72 “community” championed strategic activities, initiatives and subprojects
- Embedded capacity for “shared care”
- Position/reposition HPC in Canada
- Embedded capacity for education
- Embedded/enduring relationships
- Robust legacy of planning tools, learning resources, decision supports



Collaboration Strategies

- Fund/support “lighthouse” activities
- Leadership in process management
- Link/broker academy & community
- Direct project management support
- Enable broad access to materials



Collaboration Strategies

- Leverage local resource innovation for pan-Canadian application
- Support inter-sectoral and multi-jurisdictional strategic activity
- Program planning/technical support
- Support inter-sectoral stakeholders to engage regionally and nationally
- Coordinate/enable collaborative development of resources
