This course takes an interprofessional approach and promotes teamwork and collaboration among different health care professionals who work in hospital settings.

Who is it for?

LEAP Hospital is ideal for any health care professional (e.g. physician, nurse, pharmacist, social worker, etc.) working in a hospital setting, whose primary focus of work is not palliative care but who provides care for patients with life-threatening and progressive life-limiting illnesses.
